Richard has successfully lead Council through a difficult period in the last few years which were marked by CoViD-19, lockdowns and cancelled meetings and events. Yet Council has emerged as a more cohesive and stronger group, with an increase in the number of Affiliates and a consequential increase in the number of motoring enthusiasts that are now represented by Council.

Richard has overseen the refurbishment of the Pie Cart's electrical system, the building of a dedicated shelter for the Pie Cart in Yarralumla and it's relocation to its new home; the implementation of the Council's Carbon Offset Project, providing funds for land reclamation work in the ACT; several very successful Wheels events in Queanbeyan; and the agreement by ACT Government to changes to the ACT's Concessional Registration Scheme (60 Days & a Modified Historic class) and progression of those changes to where implementation is now almost imminent.

Prior to Richard's stint as President, he was a dedicated and active Delegate on Council for the Mercedes Benz Club of ACT for the past decade; he was a co-organiser of Wheels for several years; actively promoted events such as German Auto Day, for the benefit of members with any German marque and all motoring enthusiasts generally; and represented Council as a Judge at a number of Auto Italia events in recent years.
